

# Rocky Mountain Riders Association 2024 Rulebook

Revised: 01/12/2024

## **DISCLAIMER:**

The rules and regulations set forth here are designed to provide for the orderly conduct of racing events and to establish minimum acceptable requirements for such events. These rules shall govern the conditions of all events, and by participating in these events, all participants are deemed to have complied with these rules. No express or implied warranty of safety shall result from publication of or compliance with these rules and/or regulations. They are intended as a guide for the conduct of the sport and are in no way a guarantee against injury or death to a participant, spectator or official. All riders are responsible for their own medical insurance.

These supplemental regulations may not be in conflict with National AMA rules and in the event of a protest or appeal; judgment will be based on information contained in the AMA rulebook.

The Rocky Mountain Riders Association (RMRA) is a not for profit volunteer organization made up of individuals interested in the furthering in the sport of Motocross and Supercross.

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# RIDER RULEBOOK

All members (Competition, Clubs, and Promoters) must accept the obligation to be governed by the decisions and rules made by the Rocky Mountain Riders Association (RMRA) and American Motorcycle Association (AMA).

## 1) Membership Info:

- a) AMA membership is required
- b) RMRA membership is required to compete for motocross & supercross.
- i) RMRA Full memberships will be \$40 and are good for the current race year.
- ii) There will be a \$20, one-day membership to ride in a one-day sanctioned event. No points will be given. One day sign-ups will count towards the total number of year end awards awarded.
- c) A copy of a birth certification or other legal proof of age must be presented as proof of age, for all classes with age restrictions. A youth rider's age on Jan. 1<sup>st</sup> will determine their age for the remainder of the year. Youth riders may voluntarily advance 1 age class if they will be that age in the current year, but once have done so, may not move back down to the original age class. Age advancement is final. Age for adult classes is determined by actual birth date. If you turn 40 on July 1<sup>st</sup>, then you can race in the +40 class on/after July 1<sup>st</sup>. All youth riders must have a parent or legal guardian present at all times while at the races.
- d) Bad checks-Any check written to the RMRA or race promoter that does not clear within 30 days of event will result in the forfeiture of points for the signed-up rider(s) at that event. The promoter is not responsible to the member for notification of penalty. The promoter is responsible to notify the RMRA Secretary of the violation.
- e) Educational Scholarship-Any racer holding a current RMRA card and has raced at least 50% of the current race season may apply for the Scholarship, please contact the RMRA office for details and rules. This may not be available every year.

## 2) Sign Up:

- a) If rider signed up online then they will not need to display their AMA card on race day.
- b) If a rider is signing up on race day the rider must present his/her AMA membership card and Sign-up fee(s) before practicing. The clerk must check the card for proper information making sure the sign-up card has been completed and the rider is a current RMRA and AMA member and racing the correct classes and division under his/her assigned number(s).
- c) No qualified rider may be refused entry because of too many riders unless the event is promoted and advertised as to rider limitation and classes. Qualifiers must be run when the rider entry exceeds gate capacity.
- d) Maximum race entry costs for standard events
  - i) Motocross
    - (1) Gate Entry – 6 years and up \$15
    - (2) Race Entry - \$40 for all classes on main track, \$20 for 50cc classes on small track
  - ii) Supercross
    - (1) Gate Entry- 6-11 years \$15, 12 years and up \$18
    - (2) Race Entry – 250 A, 450 A & Open Pro/Non-Pro \$50 (100% Pro Payback), All other classes \$40
  - iii) Certain events may have additional charges. (i.e. Loretta Lynn Qualifiers, etc...)

### 3) Rider Regulations:

- a) Number Plates & Numbers- All riders must have 3 number plates attached to the machine with their assigned number on their back and all 3 plates before they are eligible to participate and receive points for that event. New sign-ups that day may ride with temporary numbers.
  - i) If your numbers are illegible or missing Lap Counters will not be responsible for incorrect scoring.
  - ii) Numbers must be clear, legible and at least 5 inches high standard block letters.
  - iii) If a rider is running multiple rankings, he/she is recommended to run highest ranked number plate.
  
- b) Background & Numbers Colors- (RECOMMENDED)
  - i) Black background w/ white numbers: Novice (C) classes.
  - ii) Yellow background w/ black numbers: Amateur (B) classes.
  - iii) White background w/ black numbers: Expert (A) and Pro classes.
  - iv) All other Classes: White w/black numbers.
  - v) Pro riders may use their AMA national number at RMRA races. They may claim this number after January 15<sup>th</sup>. They must show their AMA card as proof and may claim any number not already in use.
  
- c) Rider Classification-
  - i) Pro/A - Rider Highest Classification Receives 100% Pro Payback at Events
  - ii) Amateur (B) - Rider Classification proceeding A Rider Receives Awards at Events and Banquet except Women All-star B and Open Non-Pro (B) to receive gift cards at Events and Banquet in lieu of other awards.
  - iii) Novice (C) - Rider Classification proceeding B Rider Receives Awards at Events and Banquet.
  - iv) All youth classes - Rider Receives Awards at Events and Banquet.
  - v) All riders can only race 4 classes per single day event and 6 classes in a 2 day event.
  
- d) Rider Age and CC Classification-
  - i) Youth classes and the rider ages are determined by their age as of January 1<sup>st</sup> of current year. A youth rider may advance to the next age level, but may not move back down.
  - ii) For big bike classes, age is determined by his/her actual birthday.
  - iii) A rider must be 4 or older to compete in an event.
  - iv) A rider must be 14 or older to ride a 201cc to 250cc motorcycle.
  - v) A rider must be 16 or older to ride a 251cc or above motorcycle.
  
- e) General Equipment Specifications-
  - i) Gasoline or electric only, however, octane boosters will be allowed.
  - ii) All motorcycles shall have frame, wheels, handlebars, proper working controls, fenders, gas tanks, exhaust systems, folding foot pegs, and manual transmissions (except 51cc).
  - iii) Motorcycles will not have any sharp protruding objects or studded tires. All lights, gauges, or plastic shields will be adequately taped to prevent breakage. Kickstands must be removed.
  - iv) The referee shall have the authority to disqualify any machine/rider that does not meet the rules and standards are deemed unsafe.
  - v) All protective equipment must meet the standards contained in the AMA rulebook.
- vi) All helmets must be intact and no modification may be made to their construction that alters the helmet from the condition it was tested and approved. The helmet is made to provide protection and is not a platform to attach foreign objects. For example, cameras or other accessories are NOT permitted to be attached to the rider's helmet.

- f) Pits and Pit Vehicles- A rider is responsible for his/her pits (including family and pit crew) and their own actions. There is no physical or verbal abuse allowed on grounds or track. Golf carts, Mules and side-by- sides are considered pit vehicles. Pit Vehicle rules are as follows:
  - i) Pit vehicle use is at the discretion of the promoter and/or track owner.
  - ii) Operators must adhere to track / promoter rules and obey manufactures suggested age of operation.
  - iii) Pit vehicles may not be operated in a reckless, careless or dangerous manner, and may not be operated by anyone under the influence of alcohol.
  - iv) Pit vehicle use hours: **7 am – 10:00 pm.**
  - v) Pit Vehicle Speed Limit: must be a slow and acceptable speed.
  - vi) All passengers must be seated.
    - vii) Passengers on such vehicles are not allowed to operate past the Manufacturer recommended number of riders.
  - viii) Pit vehicles are NOT permitted in the Motocross Track or anywhere inside the track fence.
  - ix) Pit Vehicle usage is a privilege, not a right, which privilege can be revoked or terminated for any reason at the discretion of RMRA.
  - x) Violation of any of the above rules is grounds for penalty, including by not limited to: confiscation of pit vehicle, disqualification of racer, and/or ejection from facility.
  - xi) Operators under 16 years of age must wear helmets for all **motorized**, 2-wheel pit vehicles.

#### 4) Race Regulations:

- a) Practice-
  - i) The number of riders on the track during practice will be limited at the discretion of the Promoter and Referee of the day.
  - ii) The Promoter and Referee may adjust practice times according to the number of riders, daylight time and/or weather conditions.
  - iii) A rider is ONLY allowed to practice in the classes they signed up for the day of the event. Disregard of this rule will result in disciplinary actions. One practice, per class, per rider. Promoter to monitor with #'s according to listed practice order.
- b) Starting Methods-
  - i) When a rider has selected a starting gate, the rider must maintain that position until start of moto.
  - ii) The starter will point to all riders before dropping the sign to confirm rider and machine is ready. If a rider holds up his/her arm the starter will pause and give the rider up to 2 minutes to prepare and/or fix his/her machine. After 2 minutes is up, starter continues.
  - iii) The starter should be positioned well in front of the starting line so that each rider can see him/her clearly. The starter will hold a 2 minute sign followed by a one minute sign signified by holding the sign sideways and lowering it.
  - iv) The starting signal should be given as quickly as possible to avoid unnecessary delays. This eliminates excessive fouls and “jumping the line”.
  - v) If multiple classes are racing there will be a 2 gate system. Higher ranked class or classes will take off 1st followed by the 2nd gated class or classes.
  - vi) Gate prep is not allowed in front of the gate except where concrete extends past the starting gate. No tools are allowed for prepping the gate or behind the gate. Brooms are allowed for concrete starts.
  - vii) Starting blocks may be used at the starting line.
  - viii) 50cc small track isn’t required to have a starting gate.

- c) Races (Motos)-
  - i) The Promoter and Referee may adjust moto times according to the number of riders, daylight time and/or weather conditions.
  - ii) All classes will draw numbers or get randomly generated computer gate picks for the 1<sup>st</sup> moto or qualifier starting positions. 2<sup>nd</sup> moto starting positions will be determined by the 1<sup>st</sup> moto finish and main events will be determined by the riders qualifying position. If a rider does not have his/her motorcycle to the line when his/her number is called, he/she will forfeit his/her position and must wait until all others are called.
  - iii) Combining classes/stagger starting classes on race day is subject to the approval of the Promoter and referee of the day.
  - iv) For all classes other than 50cc riders may not accept any assistance on the race course during a race unless given by an Official, Medic or Flagman for the purpose of safety. A rider may receive a penalty at the Referee's discretion.
  - v) For all classes other than 50cc no one other than track officials is allowed on the track. Riders will be disqualified if parents or friends are on the track.
  - vi) 50cc racers may have 1 parent/adult on the track to assist them. If more than one adult is on the track for a particular rider that rider will be disqualified.
  - vii) Riders' front wheels must be within 18 inches from the starting device when moto is started. No roll starts.
  - viii) A rider may ride different machines in SEPARATE classes, but CANNOT ride different machines in the same class.
  - ix) Each machine must be able to pass a technical inspection. Kickstand and broken levers are not allowed.

## 5) Scoring, Qualifiers, LCQ's & Main Events (MX):

- a) 2 Moto Scoring- Your finish for the class competed in will be determined by your 2 moto finish totals. The rider with the lowest total comes in 1<sup>st</sup> and positions go down from there. If there is a tie, the rider with the better 2<sup>nd</sup> moto finish gets the better overall position. If a rider does not compete in his/her 2<sup>nd</sup> moto, he/she will get a DNS (Did Not Start) and will be considered last for the moto to determine overall positions.
- b) Qualifiers- If qualifiers are required; the scoring method listed above (a) will be overturned by the qualifying rules below. Qualifiers are required when there are more sign-ups than gates provided. When Qualifiers are being run, there is only 1 main moto.
  - i) 41+ riders: The class will be broken into 2 qualifier groups. Gate position and qualifying group position will be determined by drawing numbers or random computer drawing. The top 18 in each qualifier will transfer to the main event, the balance to the LCQ (Last Chance Qualifier).
- c) LCQ's- The gate positions are determined by the riders finish in the qualifier starting with the 1<sup>st</sup> qualifier. Example-19<sup>th</sup> place in the 1<sup>st</sup> qualifier will get 1<sup>st</sup> gate pick, 19<sup>th</sup> place in 2<sup>nd</sup> qualifier will get 2<sup>nd</sup> gate pick. The top 4 finishers in the LCQ will advance to the main.
- d) Main Events- 1<sup>st</sup> through 40<sup>th</sup> will be scored by finishing position in the main event. Those that did not qualify for the main will not receive points. If riders that qualified are not at the gate when the white flag is out for the previous race, alternate riders can be added to the main based on their LCQ finish.
- e) DNF's/DNS's- A rider who completed fewer than half the number of laps of the winning rider, or didn't take the checkered flag receives points corresponding to the total number of riders entered in the class with a minimum of 20 points. This will be shown on the score sheets as DNF. A rider who didn't complete one lap will receive a score equal to the number of riders plus 30 points. This will be shown

on the score sheet as a DNS. No rider will be allowed to make up lost laps after the checkered flag.

- f) **DQ/Disqualification:** A “Moto DQ” results in moto points equal to the total number of riders in the class, plus 40 points. A “Class DQ” results in exclusion from the class results in all motos for that class only. A “Meet DQ” results in exclusion from all classes in all motos for the entire meet.

## **6) Scoring, Qualifiers, LCQ's & Main Events (SX):**

- a) **2 Moto Scoring Option** - Your finish for the class competed in will be determined by your 2 moto finish totals. The rider with the lowest total comes in 1<sup>st</sup> and positions go down from there. If there is a tie, the rider with the better 2<sup>nd</sup> moto finish gets the better overall position. If a rider does not compete in his/her 2<sup>nd</sup> moto, he/she will get a DNF (Did Not Finish) and will be considered last for the moto to determine overall positions.
- b) **Qualifiers Option**- If qualifiers are required; the scoring method listed above (a) will be overturned by the qualifying rules below. Qualifiers are required when there are more sign-ups than gates provided. When Qualifiers are being run, there is only 1 main moto. These rules on SX are based on a 20 man gate.
  - i) 1-20 riders: The first moto may be counted as a qualifier for gate position, leaving the second moto as the main event for the final positions.
  - ii) 21+ riders: The class will be broken into 2 qualifier groups. Gate position and qualifying group position will be determined by drawing numbers or random computer drawing. The top 8 in each qualifier will transfer to the main event, the balance to the LCQ (Last Chance Qualifier).
- c) **LCQ's**- The gate positions are determined by the riders finish in the qualifier starting with the 1<sup>st</sup> qualifier. Example-9<sup>th</sup> place in the 1<sup>st</sup> qualifier will get 1<sup>st</sup> gate pick, 9<sup>th</sup> place in 2<sup>nd</sup> qualifier will get 2<sup>nd</sup> gate pick. The top 4 finishers in the LCQ will advance to the main.
- d) **Main Events**- 1<sup>st</sup> through 20<sup>th</sup> will be scored by finishing position in the main event. Those that did not qualify for the main will not receive points. If riders that qualified are not at the gate when the white flag is out for the previous race, alternate riders can be added to the main based on their LCQ finish.
- e) **Promoter Discretion**
  - i) Promoters at their discretion are allowed to modify the format for classes to a Qualifier and Main format. In this scenario riders are required to race in the Qualifier to be eligible to race in the Main.

## **7) Women's Class Rules: (Additional)**

- a) The Women's class will have 2 classes:
  - i) **Women's 14+ All Star A/B**- A riders get 100% pro pay back at all RMRA sanctioned events and Banquet. If a B rider places they will receive a gift card from the promoter within 1-2 weeks of event and they will receive a gift card at the banquet. If there is a stagger start, the Women's All Star takes off 1<sup>st</sup>. Women All Star A riders may not ride in any C classes.
  - ii) **Women's 12+ C**- Race for weekend awards and get awards at the banquet. The Women's C class will be stagger started if combined with other classes.
  - iii) **Bike sizes**-Women may not ride a bike any larger than a 250cc in any women classes.
  - iv) Women racers may drop down one Classification when racing outside a designated Women's class. (I.e. Women's A riders can race in the 250B class).
  - v) The Woman's classes do not earn advancement points.

## **8) Electric Motorcycle**

- a) Unless superseded, electric motorcycles shall adhere to ISO13063 Voltage Class A requirements as self-certified by the OEM.
- b) The vehicle shall have a system status LED. When illuminated, the LED indicates that propulsion is active and using the throttle will spin the motor. The status LED is to be located on the front of the bike and visible to

rider and officials facing the bike. LED shall be visible to a standing person when the electric motorcycle is laid down on its side.

- c) One main battery pack is allowed.
- d) The main battery pack shall display a rating label showing Pack Voltage in Volts, Pack Energy in kWh, serial number, and OEM branding. Rating label must be visible when installed in motorcycle. Access to view label shall require no too

**9) Drugs & Alcohol (Riders, Family & Spectators):**

- a) Alcohol is not allowed at the starting gate. If a rider is drinking during his/her race day, he/she may be asked to leave and/or pulled from the races that weekend for the safety of others. Rider could be put on probation and/or written up which will be determined by the Referee of the day. Points will be forfeited for that event.
- b) Drugs are not allowed at any RMRA sanctioned event. If anyone is using drugs during an RMRA sanctioned event he/she will be asked to leave. If a rider is using drugs during his/her race day he/she may be asked to leave and/or pulled from the races that weekend for the safety of others. Rider could be put on probation and/or written up which will be determined by the Referee of the day. Points will be forfeited for that event.
- c) AMA has the authority to pull a riders AMA membership card for doing drugs or drinking while racing.

**10) Firearms, Weapons, Toy Weapons & Fireworks (Riders, Family & Spectators)**

- a) Use of firearms, weapons, toy weapons & fireworks is not allowed at RMRA events. This includes toy weapons such as paintball guns, Airsoft guns & Orbeez guns. Penalty for violating this rule can range from warning to suspension of future racing privileges.

**11) Rule Violations and Penalties:**

## 12) Violations & Protests:

Protests and/or rule violations on a rider, must be written and must be presented to the referee. The protest must be accompanied by a protest fee specified in the AMA rulebook. If the protest is denied the fee will be forfeited and given to the person under protest.

- a) Teardown/Mechanic Fees- See the AMA rulebook for various teardown and mechanics fees.
- b) Protests on machine violations must be clearly written and presented to the referee. If the machine is not in violation the fee will be forfeited and given to the person under protest. An RMRA official is not exempt from this payment of this fee.
- c) Protests must be made from a competing rider, competing in the same class as the protest. If the rider is a minor, a parent may represent the rider. If the protest is regarding rules or finished position it must be made within 30 minutes after the results of that moto are posted. Protests such as complaints of course cutting and other violations must be made directly to the referee of the day within 30 minutes of the posting of that moto. The referee of the day may accept these protests without payment of the protest fee.

## 13) Flags:

- a) **Green:** Start of race.
- b) **White:** One lap to go until finish. This is a courtesy flag. Not all racer may see the white flag. All racers are to race to the checkered flag which ends the race.
- c) **Yellow:** (caution). When the yellow flag is displayed, competitors must ride cautiously until they have passed the incident that caused the flag. When displayed there is no passing or gaining an advantage and jumps must be rolled between the flag and the incident that caused the yellow flag. Failure to do so may result in the rider being docked from one finishing position all the way to disqualification from the event, subject to the referee's discretion.
- d) **Black:** Disqualification of rider. The rider must report to the referee at once.
- e) **White with Red Cross:** Indicates that ambulances, safety vehicles or emergency personnel may be on the course. Competitors must show extreme caution, slow down, maintain position, not gain advantage  
and the wheels of the motorcycle must not leave the ground between the flag and the incident. Failure to do so may result in loss of position or a disqualification, subject to the referee's discretion.
- f) **Red:** Stopping of the race for any emergency situation. Return cautiously to the starting line and wait for instructions.
- g) **Black / White Checkered:** End of race.

## 14) RMRA Board Meetings:

- a) RMRA Board of Directors meetings are held at least 8 times per year. Meeting times, dates, and locations are available to any member by contacting the RMRA admin or any Board member.



- b) At the riders' request, they may receive a copy of the minutes of the Board Meetings. If any RMRA member would like to participate in a meeting, a request must be submitted to the RMRA admin or any board member. Request received less than 72 hours before a board meeting will be included in the next board meeting.

**15) National Advancement System**

- a) RMRA follows the AMA advancement system. Please see AMA rulebook for full details.

**16) Points:**

- a) All classes will be awarded points based on overall finish, and in accordance with the established points schedule. A rider MUST complete 1 full lap in 1 moto to receive points for the day.
- b) Separate points will be kept for the Motocross series & Supercross series. Points accumulated throughout the season are retained by the rider for the remainder of the year in the event the rider advances to the next level. Please see below for points breakdown.

- g) Riders are required to hold an RMRA current membership to receive any monies or awards at the yearend RMRA banquet.
- h) Tie Breakers- In the event of a tie breaker for the championship/position overall, the tie breaker will be based on the overall championship race results in class.

**18) Classes:** Listed below are the RMRA classes available to riders. All minicycle machines must run in the class for which they were originally manufactured (excluding Supermini and Schoolboy). Mini-E Open 4-8 Will only be included in the Plate series and Supercross events.
